WELCOMING NEW STAFF TO FIRST AND CALVARY!

The year 2022 has been a time of growth for the staff of First and Calvary Presbyterian Church. Robin Jaques began working as the Communications Coordinator, tasked primarily with managing the weekly email and creating the new quarterly Review along with ad hoc projects and copy for church signage. In March, Reverend Cooper McWhirter accepted the position of Minister of Pastoral Care, working with the home-bound, those in the hospital, and performing funerals and comforting the bereaved. In early June Wendy Everts joined the staff as a contractor, serving as the new Minister of Outreach, helping build bridges to new people and strengthen our witness. Later that month, Steve Young came on board as the Director of Operations and hit the ground running supervising the office and maintenance staff, overseeing the repairs and maintenance of the physical facility, and in general, maintaining all the moveable parts of a large enterprise like ours. During that time new custodial staff were hired, Eric Carden and Brenda Weber, and Spencer Busch was promoted to Lead Custodian. Late in June, Jamie Swope accepted the position of Associate Minister, reporting to Head Pastor Don Everts. She will officially start work the first week in August 2022.

DUNAMIS PROJECT HOSTED AT FIRST AND CALVARY THIS YEAR

On Wednesday, March 2nd, First and Calvary hosted the three-day Dunamis Project Gateways program. The Gateway's program is part of the Dunamis Project created by the Presbyterian-Reformed Ministries International to guide individuals to a deeper relationship with the Lord Jesus Christ through a greater understanding and experience of the Holy Spirit's work. Wendy Everts served as F & C liaison to Tom Wilcox who led the course.

The course teaches through a blend of systematic, biblical teaching, open discussion, and practical experience. The teaching flows from a stream that goes back to R.A. Torrey in the United States and his grandson, Archer Torrey, an Anglican priest who served in Korea.

First & Calvary will host the next program in the series this fall. The Gateway's program is essential for all subsequent Dunamis programs; therefore, we recommend that those who could not attend the first in the series wait for it to be offered again at F & C. Dates for the Dunamis project will be announced as they become available.

Who would benefit from attending the spiritual retreats offered as a part of the Dunamis Project? According to PRMI, "any individual who seeks to grow in their understanding of the Holy Spirit, who ministers to others and is open to the power of the Holy Spirit can benefit from the training."

"DISCOVER YOUR GIFTS" AND THE GIFT EXCHANGE

n April 2022, Pastor Don Everts' book "Discover Your Gifts" was published. The book challenges us to identify the unique practical gifts that God has entrusted to us. When we say "practical," we mean those common, creative gifts such as cooking, writing, organizing oneself or others, arts such as painting, writing, dance, or any of hundreds of skills, crafts, or handicrafts.

In the foreword to the book, Savannah Kimberlin, Director of Research Solutions at Barn Group, writes, "I learned about my own gifts and about the collective power

gifts can bring to a community when they're truly understood, activated, and celebrated."

On May 1st, 2022, Pastor Don Everts began a five-week sermon series on the common gifts that God provides to all of us. The series was the natural fruit of Don's two-year research and writing on how God provides gifts and how we view and use those gifts for the benefit of God and the community.

The book and sermon series gave birth to a unique program at First & Calvary called the Gift Exchange in which leaders, deacons, and



elders of the church could post a need for volunteers while congregants in the church could post a description of their specific gifts such as sewing, making miniatures, writing, babysitting, and carpentry, or of their gifts of temperament such as patience, love of children, a desire to be useful or love of prayer, to name just a few. The elders, congregants, and staff would then review the "gifts" posted by congregants and match them to their needs, contacting the gift donor to accept their help.

What began as an experimental program has proven to be an efficient and effective way to tap into the unique gifts of those who attend First and Calvary and to involve them in the work of the church while providing an opportunity for fellowship.
